Appalachian Coalfields Christmas Outreach 2023 is a project run by NC Baptists on Mission. Their goal is to collect 21,000 backpacks of items to be distributed to Appalachian children in areas of need. We at Littleton Baptist would like to participate in this ministry this year.



You can help by purchasing a **NEW school backpack** that you will fill with the following items. Right now is a good time to buy backpacks.

- 1. Hats, gloves, scarves, or similar items
- 2. Three or four small pop-top canned foods (no plastic containers) beef stew, mac and cheese, fruit, veggies, tuna.
- 3. Hygiene items toothpaste, toothbrush, body wash, shampoo, deodorant, soap, washcloth, hairbrush, comb (Please fit these items into one gallon Ziploc bag so they do not leak)
- 4. Fresh, wrapped candy No chocolate or peanuts.
- 5. At least 1 or 2 NEW, age-appropriate non-breakable toy(s) (no toy weapons, please!) This can include small cars, balls, dolls, small stuffed animals, puzzles, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, card games, Legos, etc. For oldest age group (15-17) substitute an appropriate item instead of a toy, such as, a flashlight, small thermos, light blanket, ear buds, small tool kits, fishing gear, books, hunting, fishing, or sports magazines for the boys jewelry, books, ear buds, skin care products, hair accessories, small travel-sized hair dryer, etc. for girls.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE</u>: Please make sure all items fit into the backpack. Please stick carefully to the list above. This backpack is not for school supplies. Our mission committee is getting Bibles for the backpacks.

Age Grouping and Labeling. Each backpack should be labeled boy or girl as well as the appropriate age. Age groups for this year are **4-7**, **8-10**, **11-14**, **15-17**. See Betty Anne for a check off form that needs to be attached to your backpack.

We ask that you prepare your backpack as you would for your own child or grandchild, with new items, not used ones. This quality gift could be the only Christmas present this child receives and will be a witness of Christ's love!

Please bring your backpacks to church by **Sunday, October 22nd**.
