What we found were countless personal treasures we'd long since forgotten. These treasures help us remember special people and occasions as we found numerous pictures of family holidays and vacations. documents like baptismal childhood certificates. memorabilia and so much more. While many things were discarded. some things found will forever be in our treasured file of memories.

Discovering such treasures reminds us of the treasure we have in God's Word, sometimes due to lack of reading and meditation. The Holy Bible is truly a wonderful book. Oh, that we might continually unpack the truth in this precious book. In Tricia McCary Rhodes book,

<u>The Soul at Rest</u>, she describes three simple words which can enable the read-

rediscover the treasures found in the Bible. The first word is STOP. Rhodes writes, "open your Bible with a gentle spirit and quiet soul. Read slowly until something urges you to STOP." This may happen after only a word, a sentence, or a phrase. This pause is intended for the reader to set their mind on the Spirit and focus inwardly on Christ. One of the real dangers in reading Scripture is we can easily neglect this vital element. We can spend so much time reading that we never stop long enough to allow God to speak to Even in our attempts us. to do spiritual readings we can reduce them to a religious duty and miss God altogether. Stop and give time for the Spirit to prompt you as you read.

Secondly, when you do stop, LOOK. Look slowly

and methodically at the words, and then allow yourself to "gaze at God." Set your mind on Him so you can be ready to hear His message for you in the present moment. If we fail to look, it is highly unlikely we will ever see.

So, first stop, then look, and then thirdly, LISTEN. Just to stop and even look alone will not get it done. We must open our spiritual ears to hear the voice of God He speaks. as Rhodes says, "Our hearts are open as we quietly ask, Lord, what do you have to say to me concerning this?" Help us to listen, Lord.

My prayer for you is that you will discover or rediscover this wonderful treasure book God has given us! There is no greater joy. Remember, Stop, Look, and Listen.


2015 VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL
