

### **PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH**

During May, our church assisted the Union Mission with a vard sale. As we searched the warehouse which was full of people's discards, the remains included couches and furniture of all sorts, books, toys, clothes, rugs and almost everything imaginable. Most were dirty and worn out or at the least no longer needed by the person. Some people sort through their bags, others do not. They become a warehouse full of collected "treasures." Thankfully we were able to sort through and make it a profitable venture for the Union Mission and her ministries to our community and those in poverty.

In Matthew 6:19-21, Jesus states, "Do not store up for your-selves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for your-selves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

When we think about these words we most often think of

money and material goods. This is what Jesus referenced. The following quote is from Encounters with Silence by Karl Rahner. "Many years ago, when I was a schoolboy distinguished by the name of "philosopher." I learned that the soul is somehow everything. O God, how the meaning of that lofty-sounding phrase has changed! How different it sounds to me now, when my soul has become a huge warehouse where day after day the trucks unload their crates without any plan or destination, to be piled helter-skelter in every available corner and cranny, until it is crammed full from top to bottom with the trite, the commonplace, the insignificant, the routine. What will become of me, dear God, if my life goes on like this? What will happen to me when all the crates are suddenly swept out of the warehouse? How will I feel at the hour of my death? Then there will be no more 'daily routine'; then I will suddenly be abandoned by all the things that now fill up my days here on earth."

This sent me to reflect upon the many things so easily stored

up that hinder our spiritual journey with Christ. Just what are we storing up as we go from day to day? What if our life continues to be focused on the mundane, the trite, the insignificant, and the routine? There must be more to life than this. God longs for more in each of his followers. We store in our soul's warehouse what we allow our mind and heart to receive. Like the freight delivered to our door, we sign the ticket of acceptance. But not everything has to be received. We can choose better.

What we allow as acceptable is a personal decision. We can allow the shallow and the unspiritual to enter, or we can store up in our soul the good and perfect gifts that come from God. Things like quality time in God's Word, reading a wholesome book, quality fellowship with believers, family communication, and engaging in service works for his kingdom.

Just what will you store in the warehouse of your soul? The choices you make makes all the difference in this world and the next.




**DEACON FELLOWSHIP MEAL**

#### **Remembering Father**

Father's Day, contrary to popular misconception, was not established as a holiday in order to help greeting card manufacturers sell more cards. In fact, when a "father's day" was first proposed, there were no Father's Day cards"

Mrs. John B. Dodd, of Washington, first proposed the idea of a "father's day" in 1909. Mrs. Dodd wanted a special day to honor her father, William Smart. William Smart, a Civil War veteran, was widowed when his wife (Mrs. Dodd's mother) died in childbirth with their sixth child. Mr. Smart was left to raise the newborn and his other five children by himself on a rural farm in eastern Washington State. It was after Mrs. Dodd became an adult that she realized the strength and selflessness her father had shown in raising his children as a single parent.

The first Father's Day was observed on June 19, 1910, in Spokane, Washington. At about the same time in various towns and cities across America, other people were beginning to celebrate a "father's day." In 1924 Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day. Finally in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the third Sunday of June as Father's Day.

Father's Day has become a day to not only honor your father, but all men who act as a father figure. Stepfathers, uncles, grandfathers and adult male friends are all to be honored on Father's Day.


