PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

Have you ever noticed how easy it is to miss things "right before our noses?" When this happens it feels so ridiculous to have missed seeing something so very obvious. How many times have we gone to a cabinet and looked and looked for something and looked right over what we went there to find? Then someone else comes along, sees the item immediately because it was right there in plain sight. It happens all the time in our personal lives; those blind spots we just can't see.

Our blind spots and stubbornness not only get us into trouble in these trivial life matters. They also can easily get us in deep waters in our spiritual life. When it comes to discerning what God wants us to see, and finding His direction for life, we can very easily miss what he wants us to see and know. The consequences are much more costly than missing finding a can of soup or a box of pasta.

How then can I know what God desires of me?

First, *spend time with God.* The more time we spend with someone, the more we know their ways and needs. Do you spend enough quality time with God in prayer, bible study, and worship?

Second, *do your homework*. Find out all you possibly can about the circumstances, needs, and what you can do! Do not be so stubborn or blind to assume you already know the answer. Thinking we know often gets us into the biggest trouble. Without doing our homework, we can wind up on a wild goose chase that leads to nowhere, or worse still, disaster.

Third, *consult the "experts.*" Sometimes we simply have to ask for help to know His way for our lives. Ask God! Ask others who can help us and have been this road before. It may be a pastor, a teacher, a parent, a friend. Be where God is and with people who know and follow Him. Learn from them. Don't let stubbornness cause you to miss His way.

Fourth, act on what you learn. Many times we learn by doing. Life is an adventure. Acquiring knowledge, even godly knowledge is not enough; we must take the leap of faith and act upon it. That's where Christian joy is found!

As the people of God, we are truly blessed! We have God to help us, wonderful opportunities to pray and worship and study and many spiritual friends to guide us along life's way. As we venture forth as individuals and as His church, let's continually seek His way in all things and when we find it, act on His will for His glory!
