PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

Spiritual writer Henri Nouwen once defined Christmas this way: "Songs, good feelings, beautiful liturgies, nice presents, big dinners, and sweet words do not make Christmas. Christmas is saying yes to something beyond all emotions and feelings. Christmas is saying yes to a hope based on God's initiative, which has nothing to do with what I think or feel. Christmas is believing that the salvation of the world is God's work and not mine." {Henri Nouwen, New Oxford Review (Nov, 1986)}

I wonder if we were to write a definition of Christmas, what would it include? I'm sure for most, it would be filled with the birth of Christ and our eternal hope for salvation and testimony regarding a loving God who sent His One and only Son into our world to bring salvation for all people. These words are not only important, but the essence of Christmas.

Unfortunate for most in our world, however, is that Christmas is not defined by words on a page, but rather by the way Christians live and celebrate this great truth in their lives. "If someone were to write a definition of Christmas by your action during this season, what would

that definition include?" My concern is much of it would likely be filled with things like activity, greed, hurry, stress, and busyness. How tragic! My prayer for each of you during this season is that your celebration of this holy season will not be defined by such things, but by His presence being "fleshed out" through worship and in all your relationships.

While activity is vital to our Christmas celebration as we express our great joy through worship, music, doing good deeds and devoting ample time for family and Christian fellowship, let us always remember the why of Christmas! Christmas is "saying yes to a hope based on God's initiative," and "believing that the salvation of the world is God's work and not mine." Christmas means making room for Him to enter our hearts and lives and to lead us down Christ's path of truth and life. Christmas allows this truth to permeate everything we say and do before others as we express this heartfelt love and devotion for our Christ who loves us so.

As I read the Christmas story and the Bible in general, I hear the expression, "fear not" over and over again. When Zachariah was told by the angel God would give his elderly wife a son, (John the forerunner of Jesus), he told him to "fear not". When the angel came to Mary the mother to announce she would be the mother of a son whose name was Jesus, and she had many questions about this seemingly impossible scenario, she was told to "fear not", you have found favor with God. When the shepherds were keeping watch in the fields by night, the angel appeared to announce the saviors birth and so startled them, the word again was "Fear Not."

In a world where terror and fear is being inflicted upon us from many fronts, may we as followers of Christ who are celebrating the greatest of all gifts, hear the words of Scripture repeated time and time again, "Fear not for I bring you good news of great joy to all people." Now that's a great definition I think. Because of Jesus coming at Christmas, no matter the many things that can potentially lead us to fear, we have a Savior who comes reminding us that no matter what, the external circumstance, our response is faith and not fear. He is near and he loves us. Just what will your "fleshed out" definition include?
