PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

JANUARY 2016

It's hard to believe that the year 2016 is upon us. It seems almost like yesterday 2015 made its entrance, and now that's history. And with each New Year thoughts turn to many ways to fix what's broken about our self and our world. More often than not however our thoughts, dreams, resolutions, and plans fall short. All of our personal efforts to 'fix" ourselves come up way short of the mark.

In the December edition of *Alive* magazine article, "Embracing Mystery," Christine Painter says we are better off replacing resolutions with developing spiritual practices to aid us in the journey through 2016 and life. As we develop these practices they help us better be the people of God He intends us to be. I have chosen a variation of five of her practices for you to consider as you begin 2016.

One: Breathe Deeply. It sounds so simple. Take time daily to reflect upon the breath that sustains your body and your life. Recognize the air we breathe is a gift, it is involuntary. Let yourself be filled with awe and wonder as you marvel at this special gift. Take just a few minutes to focus on your breathing and thank God for this precious gift which sustains us and gives us life. Discover just how blessed we are for this reminder that God is with us with good gifts, even in the very air we breath.

Two: Focus on God's personal direction as we follow His way with each new step. We won't figure out the destination so much as join Him in our journey. Reflect on your journey thus far and where you have seen God lead. Give thanks for the blessings and lessons of our journey through life with Him.

Three: Open yourself to words from God. While it is not likely you will hear any audible voice, God's Spirit directs our ways through His Holy Spirit, His written word, or in the lives of the people we encounter each day. Prepare yourself for where God might direct you in some new way or what you see happening in the moment that needs more understanding. Dare to obey him!

Four: Let go of something you would consider non-essential that may bog you down and keep you from the "main things" that matter most. Consider what is most essential to your well-being as a person, your place in your family, your church, and as a child of God. Only we know what's most important and involves using much discernment as we look at our calendars, financial resources, and investments of our time and resources. Letting go is hard work and demands discipline. This is not done by our sheer will and determination but a focus on God and his way for our lives.

Five: Remember your mortality. Like it or not we only get one life to live on this earth. Thank God for this most precious gift you've been given. A chance to be the one "you" God created you to be. Rejoice in this gift and consider steps how "you" might better be the best you possible. You only live once, make the most of your choices.

You might want to record your thoughts somewhere so you can revisit during the year and add to or prayerfully consider your thoughts in these areas.

I wish for each of you a year filled with joy as you experience Christ's presence.
