PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

The past year of Ann and my life have been challenging with her cancer diagnosis yet we have been blessed by the prayers of our church and friends far beyond measure. We thank you so very much and ask you to continue to pray after her recent excellent reports and as she regains strength. Prayer matters - but is often not easy or simple.

I share with you a previous column from some years back that adequately reflects my continued thinking regarding our call to prayer.

Prayer is a life time of discipline and difficult labor. At times it seems despite all our many practical efforts to learn about prayer and a deeper relationship with God, and all our years of praying, we still can but conclude we are mere novices. The following prayer (or portions of a prayer) by spiritual writer Henri J. M. Nouwen from his book A Cry for Mercy.(p. 50) reflects the feelings I often have when it comes to deeper walk developing a through prayer. As I read, I could easily pray the same prayer minus the books written. You too may experience something similar or you may say I'm no where close to being faithful, even though I feel

where Nouwen is, yet I can still relate.

"O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me, a sinner. I am impressed by my own spiritual insights. I probably know more about prayer meditation, and contemplation than most Christians do. I have read many books have even written a few myself. Still, as impressed as I am, I am more impressed by the enormous abyss between my insights and my life.

It seems as If I am standing on one side of a huge canyon and see how I should grow toward you, live in your presence and serve you, but cannot reach the other side of the canyon where you are. I can speak and write, preach and argue about the beauty and goodness of the life I see on the other side, but how, O Lord, can I get there? Sometimes I even have the painful feeling that the clearer the vision, the more aware I am of the depth of the canyon... Sometimes I feel imprisoned by my own insights and "spiritual incompetence." You alone. Lord can reach out to me and save me. You alone.

I can only keep trying to be

faithless most of the time. What else can I do but keep praying to you, even when I feel dark; to keep writing about you, even when I feel numb; to keep speaking in your name, even when I feel alone. Come Lord Jesus. come. Have mercy on me, a sinner. Amen."

Whether you feel a novice, about the Christian life, and lifelong learner, or both, I suspect you feel inadequate when it comes to your prayer journey. His final words are the most important for us. Keep praying, even when we feel dark and numb. Keep speaking name even when we feel alone in our prayers. God knows our need and hears us! God alone is merciful to us even when we feel alone in our prayers. Don't give up! Press on to a life of prayer and faith where you spend time with Him, even if you do seem to be "on the other side of the canvon." Never forget, God is everywhere hearing our every need, even when we can't seem to realize it ourselves.

> Keep journeying deeper into your life of prayer. God is patient and merciful! And He hears our every prayer!
