THOUGHTS ALONG THE WAY

In the Gospel narratives, the parables of Jesus are found in many different settings. One of the most beloved of the parables is found in the Gospel of Luke, chapter 10, verses 25 through 37. We call it *The Parable of the Good Samaritan*.

Luke provides us the setting as he tells us that an expert in the law sought to test Jesus with this question: *Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?*

Jesus answered: What is written in the Law? How do you read it?

The expert in the law replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, Love your neighbor as yourself.'

Jesus responded: You have answered correctly. Do this and you will live.

Luke goes on to tell us: But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, And who is my neighbor?

After sharing a moving story of exceptional kindness, Jesus poses the question: Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?

Luke tells us that the expert in the law replies, The one who had mercy on him.

Then Jesus responds, Go and do likewise.

Eminent Swiss Protestant theologian, Emil Brunner, whom I studied during seminary days, has written the following:

Our relationship with God and our relationship with our neighbors are never two different things but are one and the same. We cannot sin against God except by doing wrong to one of our brothers. The opposite is true, too. If our relationship with God is made new, our relationship with our fellow men is made new by the same token. In other words, we cannot receive mercy and love from God unless we are in turn full of love and mercy toward our brothers.

Brunner was only bearing out what Jesus taught by the parable. We read in I John 4:20, Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen.

The truth is: If we have not learned the message of love from God's Word, then we have missed the entire message.




There have been some concerns on our church security during our Sunday morning worship service. Our church is taking the following safety measures each Sunday morning.

The nursery workers lock the kitchen door and then nursery door to the outside just before the service begins. People are directed to the front door. As the service begins, the side door to the parking lot is locked. After the first hymn in the worship service is sung, an usher checks the parking lot to see if there are any late comers and if none he will lock the front doors. The side door beside the water cooler stays locked at all times.

At the present time, we are investigating a possible signaling system for late comers. If you have any suggestions, please inform a deacon.
