PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

March is finally here. There are so many things going on in March it is hard to pinpoint what is the most important. You have Daylight Savings Time (SPRING YOUR CLOCKS FORWARD), Spring begins, and even St. Patrick's Day. March is a full month of so many things. Each one of these is important in their own right.

So do I talk about moving our clocks forward? Do I talk about our eternal spring? Or even the luck of the Irish with St. Patrick's Day? Or none of these? For also in March is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent.

MISSION OPPORTUNITIES


