PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

It is hard to believe that we have been in quarantine for over 2 months now. But the good news is the state is reopening. We are able to start doing more things. And that also means church. Through the month of June we will still be having church virtually. But the great news is that we can see the light at the end of the tunnel. Our target date for our in-person worship will be July 5th. With all of that said, the deacons and church council have a plan in place for how we will re-open. Further in the newsletter you will find our detailed plan of what we will be doing to keep people safe and make sure we are doing everything to keep the church as clean as possible.

The first step that we are taking in reopening our church is that we will be moving our virtual church from 4:00 PM to 11:00 AM beginning the first Sunday in June. This will help in the transition of getting people back to our usual time of worship. This is just a starting point for us.

One thing I do want to note in this section is about the issue of masks. While we will not be requiring you to wear a mask to enter our building, we are heavily encouraging you to wear a mask. If you do not have a mask, we will have some to be given out. Wearing a mask does help in preventing the spread of any germs that you may have to other people. We must remember that the majority of our congregation is in the high-risk zone. So by wearing a mask you will be showing love to them. You will be telling them that you love them. This is following Jesus' commandment: love your neighbor as yourself. We want all of our congregation to feel safe when they come back to worship with us.

Another note I would like to make. I know that many people are still feeling an unease of coming back into crowds again. This is completely understandable. If you feel uncomfortable or are in the high-risk area, we do still encourage you to stay home. If you are feeling sick in any way, we encourage you to stay home. We will still be offering our worship services virtually. Do not feel bad about missing in-person worship for you can still worship with us. We will also continue offering the service on CD for those who do not have internet.

I look forward to July and being able to worship as one body again. Until then I look forward to seeing you all virtually each Sunday morning.

MISSION TRIP FOR REPAIRING HURRICANE DAMAGE

Volunteers can come part of the week if their schedules do not allow them to work the whole week. Medical forms (and permission slips for youth) will need completing. Our Deacon Board and Church Council have been hard at work planning for our church re-opening. We have decided to set July 5, 2020 as our target date to resume services in our church sanctuary. This opening is subject to change due to the status of the coronavirus.

We will be taking many precautions when we first get together and ease back into normalcy as we feel it is safe. We understand that some of these things might be inconvenient. Our prayer is that these precautions will keep our church body as safe as possible. Please consider each one of these as we prepare for indoor church services. With our church needing more cleaning, if you are able to find any hand sanitizer or disinfectant wipes and would like to donate them to the church, it would be greatly appreciated.

The following are precautions our church will be making:

1. The sanctuary and fellowship hall will be disinfected before each service.
2. We will have masks available for all people and encourage them to be used.
3. Hand sanitizer will be available in many locations throughout the church.
4. Sunday School will be in the fellowship hall with chairs spaced at a safe distance.
5. There will be no nursery for the time being.
6. There will be no bulletins.
7. Deacons will be seating people in the sanctuary at a safe distance.
8. Offering plates will be located near the doors so people can give their tithe as they enter or exit the church.
9. Congregational singing will be suspended for a while. The choir will also not be singing. The choir special will be an instrumental by Laura or a soloist.
10. We will not have our normal greeting time.
11. Children will remain with their family during the children's message.
12. A "prepackaged communion box" will be available for people to pick up as they enter the sanctuary on Communion Sunday.
13. At the close of worship we will dismiss people by rows and encourage people to visit each other outside. The doors will be open so no one will have to touch handles.
14. If you are sick or are uncomfortable attending, please do not feel bad. We will continue Facebook Live and mailing out CDs of our worship services.
