PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

March is finally here. There are so many things going on in March it is hard to pinpoint what is the most important. You have Daylight Savings Time (SPRING YOUR CLOCKS FORWARD), Spring begins, and even St. Patrick's Day. March is a full month of so many things. Each one of these is important in their own right.

So do I talk about moving our clocks back? Do I talk about our eternal spring? Or even the luck of the Irish with St. Patrick's Day? Or none of these? For as we enter March, we are also in the midst of Lent. Lent began with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. And Lent will continue all the way until Easter in April.

Lent is to Easter as Advent is to Christmas. It is the time of the year where we prepare our hearts to remember the cross and the death of Jesus. It is a time to meditate on the things that we have done in our lives that cause us to stumble and fall.

As we journey together in Lent, we will be continuing our series on what it means to wander. We began last week by looking at the Israelites wandering through the desert wilderness. This week as we come to the table of Holy Communion, we look at how the Israelites wandered in silence. For 400 years, God did not send a prophet. What was it like living during those 400 years? What was happening?

March 12th, we then jump backwards a little to look at the Israelites as they wandered through the Babylonian exile. This was a hard time for them, but yet God continued to give them hope even during the tragedy. What can we learn through their time of wandering?

On March 19th we look at a time when Jesus was alone and wandering in his own thoughts as he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane. What does this mean for us?

And we conclude our series by looking at the Prodigal Son to discuss our own times of wandering. We have journeyed with others during their own wandering and trying to put it into context for ourselves, but as we journey with the Prodigal Son, it makes us truly examine our own times of wandering away from God.

So I hope you join us as we examine what it means to wander in the wilderness, wherever that wilderness may be for you. I hope this series prepares your own heart during this season of Lent as we prepare ourselves for Holy Week as we remember the death resurrection of Jesus.

HISTORY OF THE LITTLETON BAPTIST CHURCH FACILITIES



Each time Littleton Baptist Church gathers in its current facility there is a marvelous history of faith and dedication worthy of our thanksgiving.

The first building, located on Church Street (near the Hardware store) was completed during the year 1878, and dedicated on the second Sunday in August of that year some five years after the church was founded. Previously she had met in the upper room of a store owned by two of its founding members. On August 4, 1907, Rev. J. P. Bowers initiated a movement to build a new house of worship. During his pastorate a lot was purchased on Mosby Avenue from Captain J.L. Leach and the foundation for the new structure was laid. Much time past in difficult years and the new church building was then completed during the pastorate of Rev. H. Reid Miller and dedicated on Sunday, May 16, 1920. The stained-glass windows are a testament to the beauty and witness of this facility.

In 1954, the first sanctuary was fully renovated and "turned around" and the present education building of classrooms and fellowship hall were added. The first service was held December 12, 1954. Since that time the church has been remodeled several times, the latest in 1995.

On July 2, 1948, the church dedicated its parsonage on 115 Johnston Street. In March of 1963 the parsonage was enlarged and remains in use today by our pastor. Over the years it has served as a beautiful and practical home by 10 of its pastors, including this former pastor for over 17 years.

In 1999, the church purchased the Newsom property adjacent to the church and added a paved lot with driveway and parking for 60 cars. This addition greatly added to the visibility and usability of our facilities. In 2007 the church was blessed to purchase the corner property and house, having previously served as the Methodist Parsonage. This facility is used to house our church office with space for small group meetings and provide space for storage for the Living Nativity and so much more.

In 2008, the church completed an Accessibility Building Project which included the addition of two new handicapped bathrooms near the vestibule, new handicapped accessibility from the parking lot, new carpet throughout the church, and complete handicapped accessibility from the sanctuary to the fellowship building.

As the church continues its ministry, the building serves as a reminder to the community that we are here. The building continues to change and update. In the last year we have added new technology to allow our worship services to be streamed online. We have also added a wonderful new playground so the children of the current and future generations have a wonderful place to play. The playground will be dedicated later this year.

Give thanks to God as He continues to bless LBC with marvelous facilities and the church continues to upgrade and maintain them for his glory into the future.
