PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

Soren Kierkegaard once said, "A man prayed, and at first he thought that prayer was talking. But he became more and more quiet until in the end he realized that prayer is listening." We all know listening is hard work. Listening probably demands a lot more of a person than even talking does. A popular wire-less phone company had a commercial in which a man with a cell phone continually asked every few feet, "Can you hear me now?" Of course the reason is to prove the point regarding the excellent coverage they give their subscribers. If God didn't already know, I suspect He may be asking a similar question of each of us. One thing for sure, it's a question we need to continually ask of ourselves. Are we hearing God as He continually desires to communicate with us?

Unlike we've been programmed spiritually to believe, I believe a large part of prayer is listening. I think it is crucial in our Christian walk to continue to ask ourselves, just how well am I listening to God? Perhaps the first question you may have is, just where can I hear God speaking? The answer is multifaceted and unlimited.

Let me mention a few as suggested by Marjorie Thompson in the book, Soul Feast.

- We can hear God speaking through the words of Scripture. Read a psalm and open yourself up to the Spirit and allow God to speak to you personally.
- We can hear God speak through His creation around us. One only has to see a butterfly, a mountain, a giraffe, or a sunset to hear God speak His joyful praise and proclamation.
- We can often hear God through words and lives of others a preacher, a parent, a spouse, a friend, even a stranger can be the voice of God's Spirit.
- We can hear God in the circumstances of our lives. Some circumstances are good, some not so good. Yet in and through them we may hear God slowing us down or calling us to attend to something we might have overlooked or denied.
- We can hear God in the silence when we make room for His still small voice to address us by name. Yes, God is hearable. But we must each give attention, not just with open ears to the many voices God may use to speak to us, but also by using discernment. Not every voice we hear is the voice of God. We must continually be learning the characteristics of God, in order to recognize Him when He is speaking to us.

I'm so thankful we serve a God who loves us personally and longs to speak and hear from each of us. Remember, God continues to ask "Can you hear me?" God longs for us to have "ears to hear" His voice as He speaks. Are you listening? Are we as His church listening? This makes all the difference in our walk with Him.

While you're praying and listening for God this month, please center your prayers on the following needs: VBS, Outdoor World Ministries, our church financial needs, our graduates, our father's and our babies and their families as they are dedicated. God will give us direction in these areas as we pray earnestly seeking Him.

Thanks for the blessing of serving as your pastor and the chance to listen for God with you on behalf of LBC.

#### JOINT DEACON & FINANCE/STEWARDSHIP COMMMITTEE MEETING UPDATE

On May 5, the Deacons met jointly with members of the Finance & Stewardship Committee. The meeting served a two-fold purpose. <u>First</u>, we are continuing to explore the request from the January Quarterly Business Meeting concerning the development of recommendations for a different approach in preparation, presentation and adoption on our annual church budget. During the January Business Meeting several individuals expressed the thought that our current practice of presenting the Budget following a Sunday Worship in the Fall with an open show of hands to approve does not afford an inviting, adequate opportunity for individual comment and input. During the Business Meeting the church voted to revise the procedure and use a "written ballot" to vote on the proposed Budget in lieu of a "show of hands." The church also directed the Deacons to explore methods to develop and present the proposed budget that allow input into the budget prior to the day of adoption. The Finance & Stewardship Committee are to explore possible ways to make the Budgeting process more transparent with greater input by the Congregation that does not involve standing up before the whole church to offer suggestions.

<u>Second</u>, in our May 5 joint meeting we also focused on the general topic of church stewardship. We looked at the wonderful opportunities to express our love and service afforded by giving and financial support of the Lord's work through Littleton Baptist. We explored ideas of how we can all be more aware of minimizing the cost of providing a comfortable, inviting worship and study space for both ourselves and guests by controlling lighting usage and by watching carefully the settings on thermostats. You do not need us to tell you that the costs of utilities are rocketing to historic records, because you see your own bills for propane, oil and electricity telling the story. Clyde shared with the group the disproportionate impact of utility costs on our budget. Perhaps you have some saving ideas to share with us.

<u>Finally</u>, in this May 5 meeting we reviewed the Church Constitution to remind ourselves of the responsibility of the Deacons and the Finance & Stewardship Committee Members. Clearly, these two groups have the assigned objective of "Keeping a careful watch over the church's income and expenditures, and advising the church of any steps it needs to take concerning same." In the meanwhile, if you have any concerns or questions regarding our giving or expenses, you are invited and encouraged to discuss it with me as the Deacon Chairperson, with Mike Currin as Pastor, with Clyde Johnston as Treasurer or Kay Beaver as Stewardship Committee Chairperson. We will work to get an answer for you. We also encourage you to make church stewardship a part of your prayer time. The brothers and sisters at this joint meeting made a personal commitment to pray daily concerning the finances of Littleton Baptist. We will keep you informed on developments.
